ARE THERE DIVISIONS AMONG US?

In 1 Corinthians 1:10 Paul is pleading with the brethren in Corinth. What is the PLEA? (that we speak the same thing, that there be no division among you, but that you be perfectly joined together, in the same mind and in the same judgment.) Could he be talking even to us today about DIVISIONS. Maybe not those exact things that he is addressing at Corinth. But there are all sorts of things that can cause us to be divided.

Like the things he brings out to the church in Galatia in (Galatians 5:19-21) the works of the flesh, adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lewdness, idolatry, sorcery, hatred, contentions, jealousies, outbursts of wrath, selfish ambitions, dissensions, heresies, envy, murders, drunkenness, revelries, and the like.

And he goes on to write in the next few verses (22 -26). The fruit of the Spirit, love, joy, peace, long suffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit.

I believe we have the tendency to bring about division by what we want and really don't stop to think what the Lord wants and even commands of us.

In (Galatians 6:9-10) And let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart. Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all, especially to those who are of the household of faith.

(Galatians 6: 18) Brethren, the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit. Amen.
